

International colloquium *Urgent decision-making*

Paper submission guidelines

Theme of papers

Proposals for papers should relate to decision-making in complex and/or urgent situations and should correspond to one of the four topics proposed, clearly stated by the author(s). Papers may relate to various fields of study, such as high-level sport, teaching, health, social intervention, the armed forces, etc. They may cover different scientific disciplines, such as Science and techniques of physical and sports activities, Educational sciences, Sociology, Cognitive ergonomics, Neuroscience, Emergency medicine, and Psychology, etc.

Nature of papers

Contributors may propose two types of paper:

- An oral presentation covering a particular topic (20 minute presentation + 5 minute discussion);
- A poster covering a particular topic.

Language

Communications should be in French or English. The authors of papers presented in English should ensure that their supporting communication materials are provided in advance in French. Proposals for papers should be made in the same language as that of the presentation.

Detailed requirements

Proposals for papers to be presented orally or as posters should comprise:

- A title;
- An abstract including (i) a summary (not to exceed 1,000 characters, spaces included), followed by (ii) a short text (not to exceed 7,500 characters, spaces and bibliography included, with a maximum of 5 references).

Proposals for papers should be submitted via the Internet using the [on-line form](#) specifically designed to ensure compliance with these requirements. Any proposals for papers that do not comply with these requirements will automatically be rejected by the platform.

Information for oral presentations and posters

· Posters

- Format: A0 (841 x 1189 mm)
- Page orientation: Portrait
- Each poster should be readable from a distance of 1.5 to 2 m.
- Language used: French or English.
- Posters should be displayed in the designated locations, with the assistance of the organizers, prior to their presentation. A specific time will be allocated for their presentation, and they should be removed by participants at the end of each session.

• ***Oral presentations***

During open oral sessions, authors will have 20 minutes to present their work, followed by 5 minutes for questions and answers with the audience.

Evaluation of proposals for papers

Anonymized proposals for papers will be assessed by the scientific committee using the following criteria:

- Interest and pertinence of the subject with regard to the topic selected;
- Theoretical framework;
- Method: collection and processing of data (if a research paper);
- Analysis and interpretation of results (if a research paper);
- Discussion (if a research paper);
- Pertinence of references;
- Quality of writing of text and summary.

The organizing and scientific committees reserve the right to modify the type of papers from that initially requested from contributor(s).
